

Crew Security Awareness & Response (CSAR)

Piracy on the high seas has occurred for centuries and is an enduring problem faced by many seafarers. However, with kidnap for ransom economies now growing throughout the world's major shipping lanes, mariners are increasingly finding themselves placed at risk, often unprepared and with minimal support.

As a crewman, that isolated feeling of not knowing whether or not you are at a higher risk of boarding by pirates can not only make you feel extremely vulnerable, but also create a lack of psychological preparation should the worst happen.

The CSAR course has been developed as a result of the clear training requirement for ships crews to receive maritime security awareness and emergency response training in the event of a piracy incident.

Why attend this course?

The CSAR course provides crews with practical training in Anti-Piracy prevention measures, effective responses and action to take in the event of a hijack incident.

The International Ship and Port Facility Security Code Part A 13.3 mandates that shipboard personnel shall have sufficient knowledge and ability to perform their assigned duties. Guidance at Part B, 13.5 of the code further states that the objectives of drills and exercises are to ensure that shipboard personnel are proficient in all assigned security duties. It is the responsibility of shipping managers to ensure the appropriate security measures are in place to safeguard their crew in accordance with basic employee duty of care and the CSAR course should form part of a crew's hostile environment pre-deployment training.

Benefits

The course is designed to help a ship's crew understand how to make their vessel a hard target to pirate attack. It also helps to build team resilience within the crew and ensure that should the worst happen and they become a kidnap victim, they are aware of the action that they should take to reduce the risk.
